Musical Blessing from Noreen Aasen, Spiritual Care Coordinator

Merry Christmas to each of you and may the year 2021 be a New Year very different from the one we have experienced in 2020!

Roger Whittaker sings:

Christmas is here again, Stand up and cheer again Let's leave our heartache and sorrow behind.

Although we have all walked through a difficult year, Christmas is truly a time of Cheer! The birth of Christ brings hope and joy into a dark world just like it did years ago in Bethlehem.

One source of joy and hope in this advent season is music. Did you know that the Gospel of Luke actually holds three "ancient advent hymns"? I'd encourage you to look into them. They speak of joy, servanthood and trust in God in unusual situations.

The first one is known as Mary's

Magnificat. Mary says "My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior...for He who is mighty has done great things in me." Mary was in a serious situation. She wasn't speaking lightly. However, she was acknowledging that God was with her and she was willing to obey Him.

Secondly, there is Zechariah's blessing after the birth of his son, John the Baptist. Here Zechariah blesses God and prophesies of the deliverance God will bring to His people. Remember we are His people and the sheep of His pastures. He declares," (He) will give light to those who sit in darkness and in the shadow of death, to guide our feet into the way of peace."

Thirdly, Luke tells us of the Angels' amazing Choir singing "Glory to God in the highest and on earth peace among those with whom God is pleased". Imagine being one of the shepherds

and hearing this glorious song. And then not only hearing it, but going and finding all that they had said was true. Imagine actually seeing the Christ Child and recognizing that it was Him, our Messiah!

Then lastly, there is the song of Simeon. He takes the baby Jesus in his arms and sings, "Let your servant now depart in peace, for I have seen your salvation. He is a light to the gentiles and a glory to your people Israel".

We too can embrace Jesus. We can see His salvation. We can walk in the light of revelation and rejoice in Him.

So this advent season, I would encourage you to read Luke 1 and 2 with open hearts and minds, that you may experience a fresh sense of the true meaning of Christmas. That you may find cheer and peace this Christmas season.
