Circle Drive Special Care Home is a scent-free environment. This is for several reasons. One reason is out of consideration for the health and safety of individuals, families, visitors, staff, and volunteers who may have allergies. It is also out of consideration for individuals who, during their last weeks of life, may experience adverse reactions or exhibit enhanced sensitivity to smell. If flowers are particularly important for a resident, please bring flowers that have very little scent and no pollen, such as dahlias, chrysanthemums, gerbera, callas, many roses, hydrangeas and begonias.

Wellness Nordic Relax Chair

Thank you to the Kinsmen Foundation for funding the Wellness Nordic Relax Chair. The chair was manufactured for us in Scandinavia. Circle Drive Special Care Home is the first facility in Saskatchewan to acquire this kind of chair. In addition, further donations have allowed us to prepare the Serenity Room in which residents are able to use the chair. Difficulties with communicating and performing everyday tasks can take a toll on elderly people with dementia and other conditions. In time, residents may develop behaviours such as aggression, restlessness, confusion and agitation, all of which may disturb other residents and require additional attention from caregivers. Helping people relax through soothing music and tactile stimulation



can have a beneficial effect on their mood, behaviour and quality of life. The fully-automated Wellness Nordic Relax Chair along with a weighted blanket offers users a unique and

calming sensory experience.

One of our residents who doesn't speak, after spending a few minutes in the chair said, "Thank you for doing this for me." Another



resident who was restless and has had difficulty sleeping, fell soundly asleep after four minutes in the chair.

We thanked the Kinsmen Foundation by hosting a coffee time with them along with representatives from the supplier, ArjoHuntleigh.

We have found the Nordic Chair and the Serenity Room to have added much to the comfort and quality of life for our residents.
